

American Government in the 21st Century 2023 Edition

The online survey was conducted by HarrisX on behalf of the Society of Presidential Pollsters from September 8 – 11, 2023. 2,001 registered voters participated in the survey. The sampling margin of error is +/- 2.2 percentage points. Results were weighted for age, gender, region, race/ethnicity, income, ideology, and party ID where necessary to align them with their actual proportions in the population.
